This edition is dedicated to the memory of Ugly Angel 'Doc' Jones

We are deeply saddened to report the sudden death of Master Chief Hospital Corpsman Robert 'Doc' Jones, USN (Ret) from a massive heart attack on 12 May. As many of you who flew with him know, Doc Jones was very closely associated with, and deeply loved, the Ugly Angels. He also loved the Corps and always considered himself more Marine than Navy. Doc flew an astounding 1000 medevac missions, a total that is believed to be unequaled by any other corpsman who served in Vietnam. He is the holder of the Silver Star for valor, two awards of the Bronze Star with combat V, and numerous other decorations. Many Marines will swear that Doc Jones was the bravest man they know.

At his request, Master Chief Jones was laid to rest with full military honors in his Marine greens on 18 May. He rests alongside his beloved wife Betty at the Fort Barancas Military Cemetery, NAS Pensacola. The Ugly Angels were represented by Ben Cascio and Frenchy LaFountaine who, appropriately dressed in flight suit and Dress Blues, placed an Ugly Angel decal on Doc's casket, rendered a smart salute, and bid Doc a fond and loving farewell. Doc was directly responsible for saving Ben's life thirty-three years ago in Vietnam and they remained the closest of friends until the day of Doc's untimely death.

Following the untimely death of his wife Betty, in April 1996, Doc lived alone at 680 Keats Drive, Rochester, Michigan. He is survived by his daughter, Tische Andersen, also of Rochester, and two grandsons.

Throughout his Naval Service, Doc Jones demonstrated selfless courage, exemplary dedication to duty, and an enduring love for the Marines in his care. He exemplified the biblical truth, "Greater love hath no man than to lay down his life for another". May God always be with you, Doc. You will be greatly missed. Semper Fidelis!

Memorial Dedication

The dedication will start promptly at 1045 (note new time) on Saturday 8 July 2000, but I recommend you show up early so you can view the memorial at your leisure. The program for the ceremony (about 45 minutes in duration) is shown on the next page. A group picture will be taken immediately after. A two hour reception (carved beef, ham, and turkey, complemented by a modest selection of hors d'oeuvres and liquid refreshments) will be held at the nearby Clubs at Quantico immediately following the group picture.

Please come to the ceremony dressed as though you were attending a memorial service for a loved one – which you are. Your UAMF Board of Directors will be wearing coats and ties. Uniforms and Ugly Angel caps are also acceptable. We expect to be joined by members of the Carley and Cramer families. If you are in contact with any other family members of one of our lost Angels, please send me their name and address ASAP so we can also invite them to the dedication. As important as the day is to us, it's that much more important to the families of our fallen brothers. If you're planning to attend the dedication of the Ugly Angel Memorial please let me know *no later than 7 June.* This information is critical to ordering the correct amount of MREs for the reception. We have to have enough food for everyone or we're going to be very embarrassed in front of our Quantico hosts, VIPs, and other guests.

Travel Info

For those of you flying into DC, Washington National (now Ronald Reagan Airport) is about 35 miles from motels in the Quantico area. In contrast, Dulles is about 45 miles from the area. If you plan to rent a car at Reagan, allow plenty of time as all the vendors are located in a garage reached by infrequent and crowded shuttle buses.

If you are flying in on Friday, expect an extremely crowded airport, lines at car rentals, and ground traffic delays. Plan your flight and drive to avoid the Springfield interchange of I-95 and I-395 between 1500 and 1900. Believe me, you won't enjoy I-95 during the rush hour. And if it rains, you may as well sell your home and plan on moving to the DC area. You'll be in your car long enough to see your kids graduate from college!

Directions

There are two exits off I-95 which lead directly to MCB Quantico. Driving south on I-95 from the direction of DC, you can exit at either Triangle-Quantico (Exit 150) or the next exit south marked, MCB Quantico (Exit 148). The Triangle exit will take you to the main gate and the MCB exit to the more frequently used rear gate.

Enter either gate via the Visitor's lane, tell the MP where you're going, and follow the road you entered on until you come to a rotary, i.e. a traffic circle. At the rotary, look either right or left (depending on the direction you're coming from) and you will see the Base Chapel spire. Drive to the large parking area beyond the chapel/base headquarters and you're there.

Lodging Info

The Crossroads Inn: located mainside MCB Quantico adjacent to the rotary and The Clubs at Quantico. 15 rooms were reserved for 7 & 8 July at a rate of \$46 per night, but only 3 are left (1 non-smoking and 2 smoking). No pets allowed.

You may reserve a room by calling (703) 630-4444 or 1 (800) 965-9511, specifying you are with group #2132, and supplying a credit card number. To guarantee a room, *reservations must be made no later than 7 June*.

Holiday Inn Express: located just off I-95 at exit 152. Turn right onto Route 234; inn is just off to the right. 15 rooms were reserved for 7 & 8 July at a rate of \$70+tax per night with 11 rooms are still available. The motel is 3 miles north of MCB Quantico.

You may reserve a room by calling (703) 221-1141, specifying you are with the Ugly Angel Memorial Foundation, and supplying a credit card number. To guarantee a room, *reservations must be made no later than 15 June.*

If you can't find a room, call me. I have a reserve supply squirreled away.

The VA has recently determined that if a military member served anywhere in Vietnam, all prostrate cancer is now considered service connected. If the veteran dies from prostrate cancer, the spouse is entitled to dependency and indemnity compensation. If you have or

have had prostate cancer and served in Vietnam, you are entitled to a service connected disability. All claims should be made to the nearest VA office. Call the VA at 1-800-827-1000 for details.
