## Marine Corps Museum and THE WING

As many of you know, the Marine Corps Museum is now in the process of getting itself built. One way to finance this project is by selling commemorative bricks, engraved with names of donors or those of folks you might want to remember.

**Scholarship fund**: Several of the retired Master Gunnies noted that Tom Hewe's challenge letter mentioned the scholarship fund but checking the Strategic Plan found no mention of such a fund. For clarification our archivist / president dug out the following:

"1) When we first made contact with the USMC Scholarship Fund, the deposit requirement was \$10K, but it has now risen to \$25K. This is the amount required to establish a named endowment (i.e. the Ugly Angel Scholarship Fund) All funds are pooled and reinvested by the USMC SF. When I spoke most recently with BGen. Wholley, the Exec Director (and a classmate from Harvard), he promised that we would be grandfathered in at \$10K as long as we pledged to augment our gift to \$25K at some indefinite time in the future.

2. The amounts vary according to need. Since total scholarships last year totaled more than a million bucks to 981 recipients, they average somewhere more than \$1,000 per year. The grants are always renewable as long as the student performs well in school.

3. Grants are made to sons and daughters of Marines and former Marines, with particular attention given to each child whose parent was killed or wounded in action.

4. Eligibility is set forth on the website (below) and based on need. Scholarships are targeted at families with a max AGI of \$54K plus \$10K per additional child applying.

5. These can be best determined by reference to the website for the USMC SF which is <u>www.marine-scholars.org</u>."

As previously stated this issue was adopted by the board. We then articulated this to the membership at large and have been receiving donations specifically earmarked toward achieving this goal. In that we have made this commitment I believe we need to see it through. Lew

### Bob Cramer and Denny Colburn Crash

Bob:

The Uglies had been flying night medevac since we got in country. I am not sure what 46 squadron came to Phu Bai, but the MAG CO told 362 it was time for the 46's to stand up and be counted.

I had two crews already picked and on standby until the CO called and let us off the hook. I released all crews to go to chow and stand down including the Corpsman.

No sooner did I let the crews go, MAG called and said the 46's were down because of some type of mechanical problems and that we would now have to fly that night.

The first person across the tarmac to the Ready Room was Major Cramer. I asked if he would take section lead since I explained the situation we were in and the quick change that took place. He agreed! I told him I would call up to the Hooch Area and get other crews. Called the Hooch area and contacted Noel DeBord. Noel agreed to pilot the second aircraft.

Here is where it get weird! I contacted Denny Colburn in the area to fly. He flipped a coin with Miller(?) and loss the toss. Thus he had to fly. Charlie Bowers had already agreed to fly so we now had all four pilots. One small problem. Noel and Denny were not getting along too well so Charlie and Denny decided to flip co-pilot jobs. Crews were now Major Cramer and Denny Colburn and Noel and Charlie Bowers.

In addition, the Navy Corpsman was released initially when the 46's were supposed to fly. I called up to the Med Area and told a corpsman that we needed to fly medevac tonight. He came to the ready room. However, he forgot his night sleeping gear and asked one of his buddies to standby until he picked up his night gear. All of the new crews and the standby corpsman were in the Ready Room. I left for chow and am not sure who stood by until I got back, It might of been Robbie Robertson. When I got back from chow the crews had already launched on a medevac.

In the Ready Room we were following the flight by the radio and speaker on the wall. Some of the conversation was getting kind of tense from the lead aircraft because of the night conditions and location of the medevac pickup. When the intensity increased Robbie Robertson turned on his reel-to-reel tape recorder and began taping the situation on the radio.

The lead aircraft communication suddenly stopped. The chase tried to contact lead. We tried to contact the lead from the Ready Room. After about 30-45 minutes, and communications with the CO and the MAG, we had to recall the chase aircraft. Recovery took place the next day as everyone was aware.

Bob: The reason I remember this so well is when I stopped worrying when my turn might be to go to the Big Ready Room in the Sky. God had plans for them by putting them in the cockpit of the lead aircraft. Smedley has a bigger and more grand mission for them in Heaven. What is funny, when Denny and I were going through Santa Ana together, his favorite saying was, "You can't wear medals on a Madras Sport Coat!"

I hope this sheds some light on the incident!

Walt Shauer who was with HMX-1 at the time. I believe that Lt.Col. Shauer told me that Donnie and Tony had recently been found (late '69?). I believe that I was told that the aircraft had been found in the jungle, not far from highway #1, up near Hi-van Pass, just north of Danang Harbor; that the aircraft was pretty well intact and that everyone's remains were found in the aircraft.

(Regarding your request for names of the 65-66 Uglies), Frank (Francis?) Visconti did not come over with us. He was in a squadron that was already there and came is as one of the experienced pilots to help us get started. In fact, he (and the experience he had) likely saved my life: We had taken a Company or Battalion Commander into a place where his troops were operating and were setting there waiting for him to re-board. Unbeknownst to us, a bad guy was laying in a cain break or brush patch about 10 or 15 yards from the left side of the helicopter (where I was setting as co pilot). The bad guy opened up on us with an automatic weapon -likely aiming at me as there were bullet holes all

around me. I heard noise and felt something (bullet and aircraft pieces, in retrospect) hitting me, but I did not quickly comprehend what was going on -luckily, Frank was wrapping on turns and pulling pitch from the first second. Consequently, I am living proof of the folly of spraying a single target with full automatic -- if he has just drawn a bead on me and squeezed the trigger I'd likely have been a gonner. Also, if Frank had not instantly realized the danger and got me out of there, I would likely have eventually taken a few hits. Best regards,

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
## Bravo Zulu to Mike Zacker
