UH34D Helicopter Mini-Reunion Tulsa, Oklahoma October 4th

Please consider attending the UH34 bash in Tulsa and hanging out with the Ugly Angels (and our helo brothers from multiple eras).

The cost to attend this mini-reunion is \$40.00 per person. This fee covers the Friday evening reception dinner at the Post 946 Elks Lodge (about 2 miles from the hotel) and incidental costs.

Helicopter ride cost (fuel, oil, and insurance) is set at \$100.00 per rider. At present, insurance no longer permits attendees to actually fly the aircraft carrying passengers. If a few flights can be arranged with empty cabins, then some former pilots may get to take the stick. We should have that information made available a month or so before the reunion.

Examples:

If a couple is attending, and both wish to ride YL37, the check amount should be \$280.

If a couple is attending, and only one is riding YL37, the check amount should be \$180.

Hotel costs are tied to the number of attendees, so even if you do not intend to attend the Friday evening reception, you must still pay the \$40.00 registration fee per attendee.

Meal and helicopter ride tickets will be issued at registration Friday by reunion staff on the mezzanine.

HMH-362 Passes the Torch to the UAMF

On May 2013, the HMH-362 squadron heritage room contents were transferred from Major Nick Turner to retired Master Gunnery Sergeant BJ Sigman, for safekeeping. [BJ is the Ugly Angel Memorial Foundation Historian]. In a few years, Sikorsky will deliver new CH53K helicopters and the colors will be unfolded. Another chapter in the long, glorious history of the Ugly Angels will begin in New River, North Carolina.

Late last year, I got a request from Capt. Mickey French of HMH-362 for 60 of those 50-year Anniversary challenge coins and I learned he was in charge of the squadron cash sales, so I ordered some HMH-362 gear for myself and put a few on Ebay with the proceeds will go to the UAMF. The good captain was also charged with caring for the large wooden Olaf (Ugly Angel 2012 era made from the squadron sign by Jeffry Rachunek, according to Ugly Angel Jordan Hunter) and the squadron Ugly Stick. A couple weeks ago, the Ugly Stick and Olaf head arrived on my doorstep.

Tradition dictates that the junior officer of the squadron, like Bud Ellis or Nick Turner, carries the Ugly Stick and is charged with protecting it from harm or theft by non-squadron types and shifty snuffies like <u>Tad Ordoyne</u>. [Major Nick Turner said he ripped the seat out of his dress whites defending the stick from a corpsman from another squadron.] The Ugly Stick and Olaf will be at the Tulsa mini-reunion in October, so bring your camera and get some personal photos holding them.

Last week, Captain French transferred the remaining shirts, patches, stickers and shirts to me by way of a big locked trunk. You will see photos of each item along with its price as I am selling these items via email, Facebook and at the October mini-reunion in Tulsa. All profits will go to the UAMF as donations.

Most recently, we received a check for almost \$6,000 representing the squadron cash sales balance on hand at the retirement of the squadron colors last November. Now that HMH-362 has folded the colors as did HMM-362 back in 1969, the Ugly Angels Memorial Foundation is the sole repository of squadron history and the only officially organized association of Marines who formerly served as Ugly Angels over the past 51 years.

We have been adding the latest generation of Ugly Angels to the email roster for distribution of news, newsletters and reunion information via BOD members Ben Cascio and Romy Myszka. If you know of any former squadron mates, encourage them to email us to get added to the list. We are counting on the new generation Uglies to offer write-ups and squadron history blurbs for inclusion in future newsletters and we are looking forward to seeing new faces at reunions in Tulsa, 2013 and San Diego, 2014.

One great bit of recent news is that Willie Sproule is attending the Tulsa reunion, so a whole new generation of Ugly Angels will get to meet THE MAN in person, as well as a number of the original Archie's Angels.

Woodstock, IL – Leonidas "Len" John Alteno, Chief Warrant Officer-5 U.S. Marine Corps Retired, 70, passed away Sunday, April 14, 2013 in Woodstock.

He was born November 18, 1942 in Youngstown, OH to John and Helen Alteno. He was a Marine Corps veteran who served in Vietnam and Bosnia, retiring after 30 years of dedicated service. He later worked at General Motors for many years. He was an avid sailor and enjoyed shooting.

He is survived by his loving wife, Anna. He is also survived by his sons, John and Andrew, and his granddaughter, Isabelle. He was preceded in death by his parents and his brother, Gust Alteno.

He honorably served in the U.S. Marine Corps as a sergeant E5 during the Vietnam War from 1956 to 1965. His squadron, the HMM-362 "Archie's Angels," was the first to helicopter in to Vietnam, landing in 1962.

Mr. Sehnal was a past parishioner of St. Agnes R.C. Church of Clark, and most recently a parishioner at St. Theresa's Parish in Little Egg Harbor. He was a member of the American Legion of Clark, Post 328, and currently Post 493, Mystic Islands, N.J.; the Marine Corps League of Avenel Detachment, and the Red Surf Devils Fishing Club of Elizabeth, N.J. He enjoyed fishing and woodworking and was an avid landscaper. He was always there to help others and touched many lives along the way.

He was the beloved husband for 54 years of Mary Jean (nee Schiller); loving father of Lawrence E. and his wife, Denise, and Thomas J. and the late Laura Ann (1966); caring brother of Veronica Forster and her husband, William; and brother-in-law to Claire Schiller, Frank Schiller and his wife, Donna, Tom Schiller and his wife, Suzanne; devoted uncle to three nephews; beloved grandfather of Daniel T. Sehnal.

Douglas was very active with Boy Scout Troop 26 in Cromwell, where he oversaw 18 boys make eagle scout while he was a scoutmaster. He will be remembered by those who knew him as a life long racer and world traveler.

The names of MSgt Travis Riddick and Capt Daniel Bartle (former Ugly Angels) have been added to our website's list of Fallen Angels. http://www.hmm-362.us/fallen angels.htm

MSgt Riddick had served as the Flight Line Chief before going to the MAG HQ a couple of years ago. Capt Bartle had worked in Ops before going over. They both joined the Red Lions early last year. On January 19, 2012 HMH-363 lost an aircraft in Helmand Province, Afghanistan due to a failure in one of the main rotor blades that caused an imbalance in the main rotor head that ripped off the main gear box. Six Marines were killed in the crash. The initials of Bartle and Riddick were added to the 50 year anniversary coin—see tail rotor.
